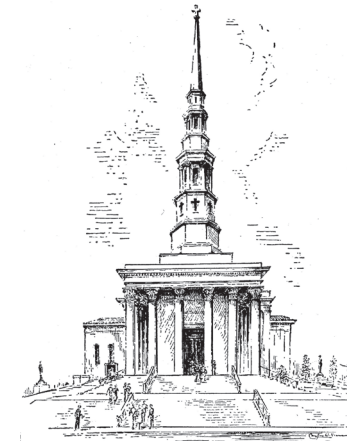
Prayer for Vocations

Nicene Creed
