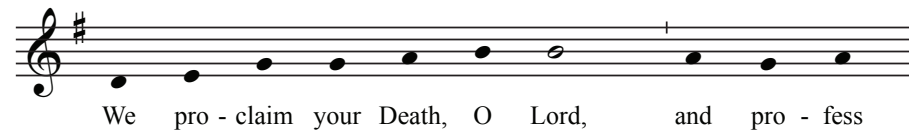

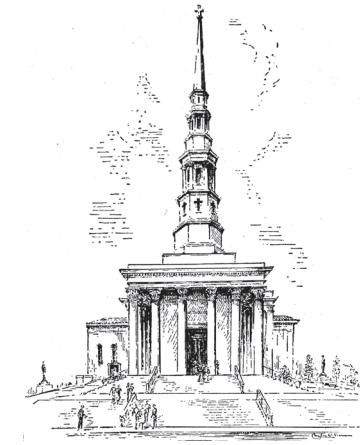

Nicene Creed
