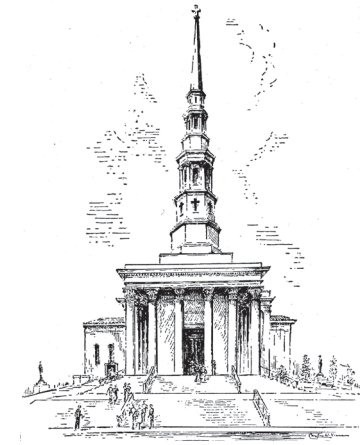

Nicene Creed
